Eligible Class Members:

If certified, eligible Class Members are all pharmacies (excluding all governmental entities):

Direct Class – in the United States and its territories that, from September 21, 2010 through April 19, 2021, paid for electronic prescriptions routed “E-Prescription Routing” through the Surescripts, LLC (“Surescripts”) network. **\$10 MILLION** has been recovered thus far in class action settlements. The deadline to file a claim has passed. Claims may still be filed and acceptance is subject to Court approval.; or

Indirect Class – in the “Eligible Jurisdictions” that, on or after January 1, 2010, indirectly purchased or paid for E-Prescription Routing transactions from Surescripts.

"Eligible Jurisdictions" – District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, AL, AK, AR, AZ, CA, CO, CT, DE, FL, GA, HI, ID, IL, IA, KS, KY, LA, ME, MD, MA, MI, MN, MS, MO, MT, NE, NV, NH, NJ, NM, NY, NC, ND, OK, OR, PA, RI, SC, SD, TX, TN, UT, VT, VA, WA, WV, WI and WY.

**Definition of
“E-Prescription
Routing”:**

“E-Prescription Routing” refers to the service that transmits prescription and prescription-related information from a prescriber (such as a physician) to a pharmacy. This information is delivered on behalf of a patient.

The Services FRS Provides: Financial Recovery Strategies (FRS) is a class action claims management consultant; we are not a court appointed claims administrator or class counsel. If you hire FRS, FRS will work within your guidelines to manage the claims process. The services that FRS provides include the following: (i) notifying you when we believe that you may be eligible to participate in settlements likely to be valuable to you; (ii) endeavoring to enhance the likelihood that all of your eligible business units (e.g., subsidiaries, divisions, acquisitions and divestitures) are included in the claims process; (iii) to reduce the support needed from your in-house staff, providing advice on what, if any, documents need to be collected and maintained, and, when requested, assisting in that effort; (iv) when required documents are not available or are too burdensome to collect, attempting to develop innovative alternatives to satisfy documentation requirements and striving to obtain approval of those alternatives; (v) preparing, assembling and submitting your claim package, and managing it throughout the claims processing phase, including working with you to address any concerns or questions claims administrators may have; (vi) providing regular updates on the recovery process; (vii) reviewing your payment to assure that it has not been under calculated; and (viii) following up with you to assure that your recovery check is deposited. How to Retain FRS: If you wish to hire FRS to file and manage a claim on your behalf, you must return a signed Claims Management Agreement and a signed Authority to File and Manage Claims. Before doing so, it is important that you understand their terms and make sure that all information about you is correct.

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Case History

Since 2019, class action lawsuits were filed in the Northern District of Illinois alleging that Surescripts offered loyalty contracts to monopolize the E-Prescription Routing market and entered into agreements with the other Defendants that resulted in inflated prices for Surescripts' services in violation of federal antitrust laws. At this time, the Direct Class entered into a settlement with RelayHealth in the amount of \$10 million (this settlement is pending final approval). The litigation is presently ongoing against the remaining Defendants on behalf of the Classes. It is impossible to predict the outcome; however, it is possible that money may become available to eligible class members if additional settlements are reached with the Defendants in the future.
