If certified, eligible Class Members are all former or current "U.S. Developers" that meet each of the following criteria: (a) sold an application or in-app product (including subscriptions) for a non-zero price between August 17, 2016 and December 31, 2021; (b) paid "Google" (Google includes Google LLC, Google Ireland Limited, Google Commerce Limited, Google Asia Pacific Pte. Limited, and Google Payment Corp.) a service fee greater than 15% on at least one such transaction between August 17, 2016 and December 31, 2021; and (c) earned proceeds between U.S. \$0 and U.S. \$2,000,000.00 through Google Play store in every calendar year from August 17, 2016 and December 31, 2021.

Definition of "Associated Developer Account":

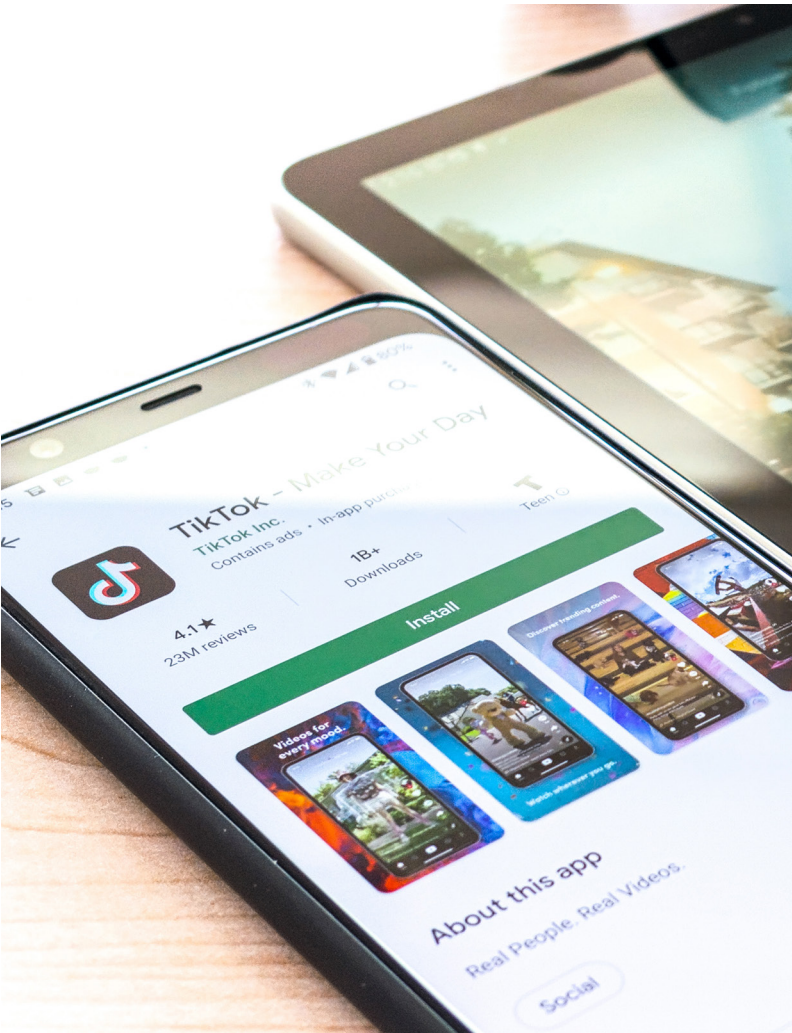
A U.S. Developer means a person or entity who has accepted Google's Developer Distribution Agreement ("DDA") and identified the United States as the Developer's country when enabling payments from Google Play.

The Services FRS Provides: Financial Recovery Strategies (FRS) is a class action claims management consultant; we are not a court appointed claims administrator or class counsel. If you hire FRS, FRS will work within your guidelines to manage the claims process. The services that FRS provides include the following: (i) notifying you when we believe that you may be eligible to participate in settlements likely to be valuable to you; (ii) endeavoring to enhance the likelihood that all of your eligible business units (e.g., subsidiaries, divisions, acquisitions and divestitures) are included in the claims process; (iii) to reduce the support needed from your in-house staff, providing advice on what, if any, documents need to be collected and maintained, and, when requested, assisting in that effort; (iv) when required documents are not available or are too burdensome to collect, attempting to develop innovative alternatives to satisfy documentation requirements and striving to obtain approval of those alternatives; (v) preparing, assembling and submitting your claim package, and managing it throughout the claims processing phase, including working with you to address any concerns or questions claims administrators may have; (vi) providing regular updates on the recovery process; (vii) reviewing your payment to assure that it has not been under calculated; and (viii) following up with you to assure that your recovery check is deposited. FRS's recovery specialists are always available to answer any questions you may have.

How to Retain FRS: If you wish to hire FRS to file and manage a claim on your behalf, you must return a signed Claims Management Agreement and a signed Authority to File and Manage Claims. Before doing so, it is important that you understand their terms and make sure that all information about you is correct.

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In 2020, class action lawsuits were filed alleging that Google unlawfully obtained and/or maintained monopoly power and unreasonably restricted competition in the market for distribution of Android OS Apps in violation of U.S. federal antitrust laws. Since then, the proposed class has entered into a settlement with Google in the amount of \$90 million. The settlement is pending preliminary approval. The settlement funds (less any expenses and fees) will be distributed if and when the class is certified, the Court grants final approval of the settlement and a claims process is completed.
