Generally, TPPs are insurance companies, healthcare benefit providers, health maintenance organizations, union health and welfare plans, self-funded health and welfare plans, and any other health benefit provider and/or entity that contracts with a health insurance company or other entity to serve as a third-party claims administrator to administer their prescription drug benefits. TPPs also include entities that may provide prescription drug benefits for current or former public employees and/or retirees and private entities that provide pharmacy benefits for a state Medicaid program or Medicare Part D, but only to the extent that the entity was at risk for the cost of the payment(s). This definition may vary per class action.
